CLASS 702. Hello, September! We will continue to work on our First Six Weeks Study during which we learn about our names and the names of friends in our class. We are learning the classroom rules and procedures and how to share and take turns with the materials. In Second Step, we are learning how to listen and focus attention so learning can take place. Every morning, we find and "write" our names as the first step towards name writing and recognition. We are starting to learn the letters of our names and how to count and identify numbers 0-20. Please remember, school drop off time is 7:50am-8am and we appreciate if you can be on time as much as possible to minimize disruption of the children's learning. Pick up time is 2 p.m. except for every Wednesday is an Early Dismissal Day and pick up time is 1p.m. unless your child is enrolled in our aftercare program. We are still working on home visits so if you haven't already had yours, please let us know when you are available after school so we can get them completed before the deadline at the end of September. 
