# HEAD START CLASSROOM 10-2

10-2 Ms. Phalesia: We will be learning about what our bodies need in order for us to move and exercise. Will also will be discussing and Identifying Anger. We will be talking about how we can let someone know that we are angry instead of hitting or crying. During outside time on the playground we will be doing an obstacle course with Hula hoops, jump ropes, and cones.
