A NOTE FROM THE TEACHERS

CLASSROOM 1

In the month of March we will be continuing our insect study. Once we finish this study we will be moving on to our Garden Study. We will learn about the tools we need to start a garden, how to plant things in our garden, and how to care for our garden. We will be investigating the parts of the plant, how they grow, what they need to stay alive. In Second Step we will be focusing on Unit 4: Friendship Skills and Problem Solving.

CLASSROOM 3

In the month of March, we will begin our study of trees. Your child will learn about the characteristics of trees in your community, who lives in trees, what food comes from trees, who takes care of trees, how trees change, and what we can do with parts of trees. As we study trees together, we will learn concepts and skills in literacy, math, science, social studies, the arts, and technology. We'll also use thinking skills to investigate, ask questions, solve problems, make predictions, and test our ideas. This plan includes activities that introduce the Trees Study and related concepts. You and your child will discover • what they know about trees and • what they would like to find out about trees.

CLASSROOM 2

Ms. Arelis and Ms. Linnette: For the month of March, we will continue with Clothes and then start Insects. We have been talking about different cultures, communities, and fabrics. The children will experience different textures of fabric and learn what we can do with the fabric. For insects we will talk about different animals and insects.

CLASSROOM 4

This month we will start a study on reducing, reusing, and recycling. In this study, children will observe, gather information, and explore their community. As we study trash and garbage and how we can recycle, we will learn concepts and skills in literacy, math, science and social studies. Encouraging children to recycle is a way of teaching them about sustainability. Learning the importance of being sustainable shows them that the environment is important.



HOME LEARNING / FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

- Planting Together - Create a window garden with your child and talk with him about how you worked together to make the window garden grow. Your child will gain experience in cooperating and taking responsibility.
- Dressing for School - Children enjoy talking about themselves and their experiences. By interacting with your child while reading a story and helping her make personal connections between story and herself you can promote her comprehensions skills.
- Let's Match - Mix up pairs of identical pictures and ask your child to find matches and name them. Your child will learn to recognize which pictures are the same and name them.
