Parents, family members, and friends, thanks for all your involvement in the program. Last month was Black History Month and I constantly was reminded of a quote I heard so much as a child. First, we must understand that child development refers to the changes that occur as a child grows and develops in relation to being physically healthy, mentally alert, emotionally sound, socially competent and ready to learn. According to research, the first five years of a child's life are fundamentally important. They are the foundation that shapes children's future health, happiness, growth, development and learning achievement at school, in the family and community, and in life in general. So, it is vital that we provide our children these early experiences. These experiences will then provide the base for their brain's organizational development and functioning throughout life. Research proves this has a direct impact on how children develop learning skills as well as social and emotional abilities. So, read with your child daily. Talk with him/her daily. Do the educational home activities with your child. Ask your child's teacher for suggestions. Call me, Ronjaneen Harris, for suggestions. Whatever you decide, make sure you give your child the gift of learning that keeps on giving. Visit your local library and ask their reference clerk what resources are available for your child. PARENT MEETING MINUTES

How to make a Dr. Seuss Cat in the Hat.

Materials needed: * Red and white construction paper, scissors, glue, pencil Cat in the Hat instructions:

Step 1. Take a large piece of red construction paper and make sure that it will fit around your child's head.

Step 2. With the scissors, cut the white construction paper into 1-inch strips and glue them onto the red construction paper. Make sure to leave a space on the red construction paper, so that it is red and white.

Step 3. Make a tube that will fit around the head and glue the edges together.

Step 4. Take a piece of white construction paper and trace the tube around it.

Step 5. Draw four tabs on the inside of the circle. Cut the circle out and the area in the circle avoiding the tabs that were drawn.

Step 6. Now cut out the outer rim...a bigger circle than what you traced and cut out.

Step 7. Glue the tabs to the inside of the red and white tube, so you can wear as a hat.
