CLASSROOM 1

CLASSROOM 3

Over the next several days and weeks, you and your child will investigate the questions such as: "What food comes from trees?", "Who takes care of Trees?", "How do trees change?", and "What can we do with parts of Trees?" As you find the answer to this question together, your child will discover how important trees are in our everyday lives.

Have these discussions with your child, see what they already know.

- What foods animals eat that come from trees.
- What foods do people eat that come from trees.
- What types of food from trees your family members or friends enjoy most.

CLASSROOM 2

May is here, we are almost done with school and Ms. Arelis and Ms. Linnette for the month of May will be talking about Balls. We will be being talking with the children about how the balls spin, bounce, roll. We will discuss what we know and want to learn about this topic the different forms of the balls and sizes. Then we will talk about how balls can be used and where. In second step, we will be talking about Friendships Skill and Problem Solving.

PARENT MEETING MINUTES

Nature Walk

Invite your child to take a nature walk together. Carefully explore the different plants, insects and flowers during your walk. Look around for any seeds you might find. Discuss what you see and ask your child questions.

Fill and Dump

Children at this stage love to experiment with cause and effect by filling up containers and dumping out. You are encouraging your child's fine-motor development as she fills and dumps by providing materials that are the right size for her or him. Small blocks or beads and large containers.

Rhyming Riddles—Rhymes

• Talk with your child about rhyming words. Explain that rhyming words sound alike at the end of the word. Offer some examples and invite your child to say some rhyming words they know.

• Explain that a riddle is a word puzzle, or word problem, that your child can figure out. Pose a riddle that prompts them to share a rhyming word. For example, say, I'm thinking of something you wear on your head that rhymes with cat, or For lunch we will be having a fruit that rhymes with "banana."

 After your child has solved the riddles, invite them to share a riddle for you to guess. Play the game until your child is no longer interested.

Was your child able to answer the riddle with the given clues? How many words did they rhyme?
