A NOTE FROM THE TEACHERS

CLASSROOM 1

For the month of May, we will continue our study on Insects until the end of the school year. Most children are fascinated with insects and their colors, shapes, movement and behaviors. Children can explore on their hands and knees to get a closer look at insects. They will enjoy investigating about them.

Our daily routine will continue by asking a question of the day about our study during large group discussions. This will assist in facilitating language development and literacy. Furthermore, children will continue exploring and investigating in different centers through play (dramatic, construction, library, art, science, table toys, and computer areas). This will aid in building their social skills such as: peer interaction, sharing, taking turns, having conversations, language, how to play, etc.

Consequently, children will continue learning their letters/sound, shapes, and counting and matching numbers with quantities. There will be a different letter and shape on a weekly basis. In addition, we have started a new curriculum called Safer, Smarter, Kids where children will learn to protect themselves in situations where someone might want to hurt or harm them, continue our Second Step Program where they are learning and practicing appropriate social skills.

Hello everyone. For the month of May our study will be Reduce, Reuse, Recycle where children will have the opportunity to learn and investigate with fun activities about different ways to save our planet. During the study the children also will learn new vocabulary, every day we will provide a question about the study, and we will have a discussion. As well, we will watch educational learning videos about recycling. We also are preparing them for kindergarten transition, teaching those Rhyming words, compounds words, syllables, shapes, number and letters identifications, etc. Also, we are doing our Second Step Curriculum. Every day children learn and practice with real examples social skills and our Second Step lesson for May are: Learning in Kindergarten, Riding the Bus and Making Friends. Practically we are teaching them the listening rules and all the skills needed for being successful in kindergarten. In addition, we will continue our new curriculum Safer, Smarter kids about Safety Rules, Strangers, Guiding voice, Private Parts, Personal Space and Safe vs. Unsafe
