Gardening with your child

Engage them through the Entire Process, From Seed to Table: They will learn that gardening can be fun and that they are contributing to the family. Be sure they alone do the harvesting and preparation of their crop for the table, no matter how modest the offering.

You may need to help out a little 'behind the scenes': Not every garden task is pleasant, and the child may not be ready at all times for all chores.

Child friendly plants:

Sunflower: A must for a child's garden, plant just one or two, since they take a lot of room. Sunflowers will sprout in one week, becomes a small seedling in two weeks, and should be 2' tall in a month. In eight weeks, the buds will flower revealing hundreds of seed kernels.

Lettuce/Mescluns: Greens are a quick and reliable crop to give the child fast results, and also a good way to interest kids in salads. Lettuce likes part shade; The seeds will germinate in 7-10 days; growing season is 40-50 days. You

Cherry Tomatoes: These may be the most fun crop for a child, plant in full sun and use seedlings rather than planting from seed. Cherry tomatoes can also be grown in containers.

Nasturtiums: Grow and yield results quickly. Nasturtiums bloom about 50 days after the seeds are planted. The flowers are also edible, an used to add colour to a fresh garden salad.

PARENT MEETING MINUTES

Things you can do at home to reinforce what we are learning at school:

Prepare your child for Kindergarten:

-Read, Read, Read at least once a day. Ask your child lots of questions about what is happening in the story. This will work on comprehension and will give them lots of practice communicating.

-Play lots of alphabet and number games. Look for number and letters around your house and neighborhood. Bring a clipboard and have your child practice writing letters, words and numbers.

-Encourage your child to draw and make up stories about their drawings. Ask them about their pictures and write down their story. As you write their responses, read it back to them so that they learn that we can write down what we say.

-Make a weekly visit to the library! Did you know that our local libraries provide school readiness activities during the summer. Call or check the website of your local library for their story time and crafting activity schedule.

CHILDREN'S BOOK SUGGESTION

Deltona Lake parent meeting:

Due to the closure of our classroom for a week this month during the time we unfortunately missed our parent meeting. I wanted to provide to all of you what is happening in the classroom and what we would have talked about during our parent's meeting.

Teacher Susan: This month we are continuing to talk about weather and seasons as we dress our little boy puppet in the appropriate clothes. We are focusing on letters U and V and will be reviewing all of the letters next week as we focus on the story, "Chicka, Chicka Boom, Boom". In science, we are learning about butterflies and acting out the life cycle as we pretend to be an egg, that hatches into a caterpillar, spin to make our cocoon, and turn into a flying butterfly. We are making the transition into kindergarten and are eating in the cafeteria with the big kids and making our own food choices.

Family advocate Anna Triplett; presented the lesson. "Making it Routine" This was the final lesson in the What you do Matters Curriculum; We acknowledged the parent's growth and development over the past five months, and how what was learned has helped their children. Discussing the different areas of development, we have been focusing on throw-out the program; such as Language, Cognitive, Social-emotional and Motor skills. The parents were reminded to remember that although they are their children's first and most important teacher they must try and take time for themselves to maintain their own physical and mental health wellbeing by taking time for themselves to recharge.

Next month's parent meeting will focus on Hurricane preparedness.
