CLASSROOM 1

Our recent study of Music Making has highlighted the musical and dancing talent among each of us. Coming soon, we will begin studying water. From splashing in the sink, to filling up and pouring out cups of water, children enjoy exploring water in different ways. We will explore their questions about the different ways people use water, how it can change from one form to another, and how it helps people and the environment. We are excited to engage with you and your child on this important topic.

CLASSROOM 2

Dear Parents:

In May, we will work on activities related to "How do we make and keep friends in kindergarten?" Then, we will start exploring about our last study: "Pets." Using the Second Step curriculum, we will review important skills they can use in Kindergarten. The concepts that we will be working on are: initials, names, counting, quantifying and writing the numbers 1- 30, review of colors, shapes (circle, triangle, square, rectangle, oval, heart, and star, diamond), and letters and their sounds: Tt, Aa, Ff, Ss, Mm, Rr, Ii, Cc, Pp, Bb, Oo, Gg, Hh, Jj, Uu, Ll, Dd, Ww, Ee, Nn, Kk, Qq, Vv, Xx, Yy, Zz. It is important to be at school between 7:45 AM to 8:15 AM, because we start the Morning Meeting at 8:10AM. Please, review learning skills, Teaching Strategies messages and do the home activities each month. Thank you!

CLASSROOM 3

Welcome to May!

At the beginning of this month, we will learn different ways to dress for the spring/summer. As the children transition from diapers to the potty they'll learn how to pull down and pull up their bottoms. Dressing and Toileting is our focus for this month. Ms. Kasane and Mrs. April

CLASSROOM 4

In the month of May, we will be reviewing everything we have covered so far from the start of this school year. We will discuss transportation! The children will enhance this theme, with play and discussion of the cars, trucks, bikes, planes, boats as well as other ways to transport.



CLASSROOM 5

In classroom 5 with Ms. Juanita and Ms. Nancy during the month of May, we will be learning more about flowers and gardens. We will plant flower seeds and watch the flowers grow. We will create flowers with tissue paper, paint and other media. We plan to read books about flowers and gardens and count the flowers we see in our surroundings. We also plan to learn some nursery rhymes and do some interactive hands-on activities related to the rhymes. Those activities will carry over from the classroom to the playground. We will continue to work on our social emotional skills, such as controlling our impulses and considering how others feel.

What You Do Matters Training Week 3: Now Hear This

Areas of Child Development: Language, cognitive, social emotional, motor

Language Development!

Expressive Language: Spoken words, sentences, and sounds spoken by the child. This is what the child is saying to us on their own

Receptive Language: The ability to understand what tones, words, language, voice inflections, and sounds mean. This is what the child hears and understands from other people

Reading with your child is so important! They learn a lot from us reading with them. Read their favorite book over and over, let them grab the book, let them talk in the middle of the story, and let them tell their own version of the story if they try to. This encourages their learning and gives them a good relationship with books

PEER Reading Technique:

- -P for Prompt: Ask them questions about the book
- -E for Evaluate: Think about what your child said and how you can add new words
- -E for Expand: Rephrase what your child said and see how you can add new information
- -R for Repeat: Ask your child to say new words again CROWD Reading Technique for kids 4 and older:
- -C for Completion: Ask your child to fill in a word for a story they know
- -R for Recall: Ask your child what happened in the story
- -O for Open-Ended: Use open-ended questions to get your child to think about what happened in the story
- -W for "Wh" prompts: Use who, what, when, where, why, and how questions to get your child thinking about the story
- -D for Distancing: Get your child to find a way to compare the story to their own life

Kids learn through hands on experiences, repetition, relationships, and their environments

Activity: Read a book with the parents using the CROWD or PEER technique
