
Classroom News

Parent Curriculum Discussions What you do matters! Week 4: Feelings "Topic: Social-emotional development. FA touched on why social emotional development is important for the ages that we serve. FA discussed how the early years of a child's life present's a unique opportunity to foster healthy development, along with importance of the first five years of life – both positive and negative experiences – in shaping children's cognitive, behavioral, social, and emotional development. The discussion also concluded that specific family and environmental factors can make a child more vulnerable to social, emotional and behavioral problems. One of the most important factors is that children are exposed to Promote quality child care settings that support social-emotional development and the mental health of young children.
