Your child might love to put on and take off his/her clothes, dress and undress a favorite doll, or try on adults' clothes to play pretend. Your child has also probably noticed that some clothes are reserved for special occasions or used for work or hobbies. This interest in clothes has inspired us to introduce a study of clothes: the clothes in your home have different fabrics, colors, patterns, sizes, closures, and uses that your child can identify and explore through a variety of learning experiences. This study-related activity offers guidance for helping your family explore the topic, investigate questions about it, or celebrate your learning together through hands-on discovery. You'll also find a question here to help you effectively share your child's learning and discoveries with your teacher.

Each month, we will be sending out two Home Activities for you to do with your child . After completing the activities, please sign and return to your teacher.
