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National Children's Dental Health Month

In recognition of February as National Children's Oral Health Month, Head Start would like to urge parents to pass on good oral habits to their children. This is one of the most important health habits parents can teach their children. For parents, this means helping your children brush twice a day, showing them the proper way to floss, limiting between-meal snacks and seeing your dentist regularly. Most dentists recommend that children start their dental visits by the age of two.

It's important for parents to give the dentist a chance to monitor their child's dental growth and development. Talking with the dentist allows parents to learn about: tooth development, the need for fluoride, how to help their child maintain proper oral hygiene and good nutrition, how to deal with their child's oral habits (such as pacifier use) and how to prevent oral injuries,

It is important to teach children from an early age that dental visits are a positive experience. Visiting the dentist helps maintain good oral health. Teaching preschoolers to brush their teeth:

-Use a pea-sized amount of an ADA-accepted fluoride toothpaste. Make sure that your child doesn't swallow the paste.

Use a toothbrush with soft bristles, and brush inside surfaces of all teeth

first, where plaque accumulates most. Angle bristles toward the gum line. Brush gently back and forth.

Clean all outside surfaces of teeth. Angle bristles toward the gum line. Brush gently back and forth.

Place brush so bristles are on the chewing surface of the teeth. Brush gently

back and forth.

Hey mom and dad!!! Raising a smart child is easy!! According to the University of Melbourne Department of Early Childhood Development on-line article, one of the biggest things you can do to help your preschooler is to read to them.

The frequency of reading to children at a young age has a direct causal effect on their schooling outcomes regardless of their family background and home environment.

Reading to children at age 4-5 every day has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills (i.e., language and literacy, numeracy and cognition) later in life. Reading to children 3-5 days per week (compared to 2 or less) has the same effect on the child's reading skills at age 4-5 as being six months older. Reading to them 6-7 days per week has the same effect as being almost 12 months older.

Children read to more frequently at age 4-5 achieve higher scores on the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests for both Reading and Numeracy in Year 3 (age 8 to 9). • These differences in reading and cognitive skills are not related to the child's family background or home environment but are the direct result of how frequently they have been read to prior to starting school.

Classroom News

During the month of January in classroom1, we were learning about buildings within our community and around our homes. Math concepts covered were measuring length, learning about volume, solving word problems, and simple written addition problems. Please work with your children on these skills at home.

In classroom 2, we learned about animals: homes, habitats, actions, care, and nutrition. Math and language skills were included within this theme.

Second Step lessons are focusing on identifying feelings, learning to use kind words, and being able to solve problems without assistance from others.

Our second VPK assessments are completed for children in classroom 1 who will be going to Kindergarten. Parents will be receiving a copy of their child's results. I encourage you to compare your child's first score with the second score. If you have any questions please schedule a time to speak with Mrs. Tammy and Mrs. Michelle.

Please continue to complete and return home activities in a timely manner each month. Our program monitors how many home activities are returned each month per classroom. Please help us to show that you are participating in your child's education at home.

Policy Council update for January 2017

The January Policy Council meeting was held on Thursday, January 26th at 10:00 am. It was a face to face meeting that was held in Leesburg. Thirteen policy council members (11 parents and 2 community partner members) were present.

The following persons were approved for hire: Ivy Sebastian, Family Advocate (Volusia County) Tony Broxton, Family Advocate (Volusia County) Amanda Phillips, Teacher (Volusia County) Ja'kera Peterson, Program Substitute (Volusia County) Elizabeth Witt, Child Development Specialist (Volusia County) Kaitlin Burton, Teacher's Assistant (Volusia County) Lillie Shells, Program Substitute (Sumter County) Carlie Nelson, Teacher's Assistant (Sumter County)

The following reports were approved: Budget and Credit Cards, Enrollment/ Attendance, Meals and Snacks, Service Area and Center. Parent activity requests for the following sites were approved: Bushnell, Brooksville, Horizon, Westside, Pathways Port Orange and Malloy.

Policy council members were advised of the update to the program's Selection Criteria which included an increase in the points for the following risk factors: homelessness, foster care and having a family member in the household with a current IFSP or IEP. An updated Head Start Public Relations Plan was reviewed and approved. Materials for an age appropriate home safety program titled "Eddie the Eagle" were distributed following introduction and discussion of the program at a previous policy council meeting.

Our Disability Services Coordinator, Denise Thompson, led a training for policy council attendees. She explained the developmental screening process and how the program works with parents to make referrals to support children.

The next Policy Council meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 23rd at 10 am. It will be a video conference meeting.

Home Activity

This home activity involves ice cubes. Let your child explore two bowls of ice cubes. Ask them how it feels. Have them hold one ice cube in their hand and tell you what is happening. Then, add salt to one of the bowls and observe the change. Talk with your child about what has happened. This is a simple investigation that will benefit children's communication skills and sensory motor development.
